

Some LaTeX Commands

Super/subscripts and any material using Greek characters or mathematical notation should be enclosed between "\$" signs: e.g. "normal text changes to \$ *math/Greek text* \$ and back to normal text".

Subscripts and Superscripts

Subscripts and superscripts are made with the `_` and `^` commands. For example,

```
x2y      x^{2y}
z1      z_{1}
```

Greek Letters

A lowercase Greek letter is obtained by placing a `\` immediately before the English name of the letter. For an uppercase Greek letter, just capitalize the first letter of the command name. For example,

Greek Letter	Lowercase	Uppercase
gamma	<code>\gamma</code>	<code>\Gamma</code>
delta	<code>\delta</code>	<code>\Delta</code>
lambda	<code>\lambda</code>	<code>\Lambda</code>
pi	<code>\pi</code>	<code>\Pi</code>
Sigma	<code>\sigma</code>	<code>\Sigma</code>

Over- and Underlining

The `\overline` command puts a horizontal line above its argument and `\underline` puts a horizontal line below its argument.
